City Ordinance Prohibits Setting Trash Out Too Early

Residents are reminded to abide by the City's refuse ordinance: **No recycling, yard waste or trash can be placed at the curb before Monday at 4 pm.** Items placed at the street earlier than the evening before encourages scavenging, attracts rodents and is not in keeping with our community that prides itself on its beautiful homes and tree-lined streets. Failure to abide by the ordinance may result in a \$50 fine.

We'd like to remind you to not place containers in the street and please remove empty containers by the next day. If you use a lawn maintenance contractor, please remind them of the ordinance so yard waste bags are not set at the curb early. Lastly, placing "free items" at the street is also prohibited before 4 pm on Monday.

"No Solicitation" Signs Available at City Hall

City Hall has free "No Solicitation" signs that can be posted at your residence. Stop by to pick one up during regular hours 8:30 a.m. - 5 p.m. City Hall is closed from 1 - 2 p.m. for lunch.
